ARTIST NOTE

Performing at the Sydney Opera House with master musicians from Iran is the realisation of a long-held dream — to honour the depth of Persian classical music. I'm deeply grateful to Genevieve Lacey for her vision and trust. In Australia, we rarely encounter the refined artistry that comes from lifelong immersion in this form of music. While many passionate musicians perform Persian music here, opportunities to hear the music carried by its living masters are rare. That's why it was important to invite artists from Iran — those who live and breathe this music every day. In a space like the Opera House, this music is experienced not as a symbol, but as a living, evolving art form.
