## 1

When you arrive at the Sydney Opera House, you will travel across the Forecourt.

Head toward the area where the star is.



## 2

The entry to all venues is underneath the Monumental Steps.



# 3

Under the Monumental Steps it is shaded and a bit darker.

If it's a busy day, there may be a queue line.



# 4

Follow the queue around using the ropes as a guide.

You will step through an electronic gate.



# 5

Staff may also want to look at what's inside your bag.

This all helps our Security Team make everyone safe at the Sydney Opera House.





# 6

Enter the Western Foyer doors.



# 7

There are bathrooms at the top of the Western Foyer.

There is also a Changing Places facility located upstairs in the Main Box Office Foyer if required.



# 8

The Playhouse Theatre is at the top of the Western Foyer.

The entry doors are on both sides of the cloakroom and the Box Office.



# 9

The doors to your theatre will open 15 minutes before the show starts.



# 10

The Sydney Opera House staff will scan your ticket.



# 11

The theatre will be a bit darker than the foyer.

Walk toward the row and seats that you have booked.

Everyone else watching the show will find their seats at well.





# 12

When the show starts, the theatre will become darker, and lights will come up on the stage.
