When you arrive at the Sydney Opera House, you will go across the Forecourt.

Go to where the star is.



2

The entry to all of the theatres is from under the big steps.

These are called the Monumental Steps.



3

Underneath it is shaded and a bit darker.

If it's a busy day, there may be a queue line.

Staff will help you if you need it.



4

Follow the queue around.

In the queue you will step through an electronic gate.



5

Staff may check what you have in your bag.

Security do these checks to keep everyone safe.



6

Enter the Western Foyer doors.



7

There are bathrooms near where you enter.

There are automatic hand dryers in the bathrooms which may make noise.

You can use the accessible bathroom if you prefer.



8

The Playhouse Theatre is the closest theatre to the entry.



9

The theatre doors will open 15 minutes before the show.

There may be a queue to enter.



10

The Sydney Opera House staff will scan your ticket.

They can assist you if you need any help before or during the show.



11

The theatre space will be a bit darker than the foyer.

Walk toward the row and seats that you have booked.



12

When the show starts, the theatre will become darker.

You will see the story of Dog Man. The set, costumes and lights are colourful like a cartoon.

You will watch a story about an evil cat who has a plan. The other characters will try to stop the cat.

There will be jokes, singing and dancing.

There is an alarm noise and explosion sound. There are slow flashing lights and smoke.

There are some thunder sounds and lighting that looks like lightening.
