## Getting to the Studio

Welcome to the Sydney Opera House.




I will walk across a large open space to the building.



The entry to the Studio is underneath the steps.



Staff will be able to assist me if I need help.





Security staff wear blue uniforms.



Front of House staff wear blue and beige uniforms.



I will see a queue under the steps.



I will walk through an electronic gate.



Staff may do a bag inspection.

Security do these checks to keep everyone safe.



I will enter the foyer doors at the end of the queue.



I will walk down the corridor.



I can use the bathroom at the end of the corridor on the right.



This is the Western Foyer.



There is a Box Office where you may pick up tickets.



If I have a big bag, I can go to the Cloakroom.

This is where staff take care of my bag. I get it at the end before I go home.



There is a café where I can buy food and drink.

I can use a credit or debit card. I can not use cash.



The Studio entry is past the Box Office and Café.



I can take a water bottle into the theatre.

I can not take food.



A staff member will check my ticket.



I will find my seat in the theatre



I can wear headphones.

I can bring fidget toys.
