ARTIST NOTE

I grew up high in the mountains in Hardanger, in the Western part of Norway, only a short hike from the beginning of the Hardangervidda mountain plateau, where one could see days ahead of walking in the vast, treeless, rocky landscape full of lakes, glaciers, and moraines. This nature has formed my way of playing, my compositions, and my way of listening. We deeply look forward to sharing the music and instrument originating from the same area, the Hardanger fiddle, performing both traditional tunes and contemporary works from Hárr (2022) and Mirra (2025), where I continue my artistic project of creating conceptual soundscapes, with the perspective of ecosophy as my guiding principle, and this time, with the reindeer taking centre stage.
